Catechesis Notes for the Week: Baptism — "In the second place, since we know now what Baptism is and how it is to be regarded, we must also learn why and for what purpose it is instituted. We must learn what it profits, gives, and works. For this also we cannot find a better resource than Christ's words quoted above, 'He who believes and is baptized will be saved' [Mark 16:16]. Therefore, state it most simply in this way: the power, work, profit, fruit, and purpose of Baptism is this — to save [1 Peter 3:21]. For no one is baptized in order that he may become a prince, but, as the words say, that he 'be saved.' We know that to be saved is nothing other than to be delivered from sin, death, and the devil [Colossians 1:13-14]. It means to enter into Christ's kingdom [John 3:5], and to live with Him forever. Here you see again how highly and preciously we should value Baptism, because in it we receive such an unspeakable treasure. This also proves that it cannot be ordinary, mere water. For mere water could not do such a thing. But the Word does it and, as I said above, so does the fact that God's name is included in Baptism. Where God's name is, there must also be life and salvation [Psalm 54:1]. So Baptism may certainly be called a divine, blessed, fruitful, and gracious water. Such power is given to Baptism by the Word that it is a washing of new birth, as St. Paul also calls it in Titus 3:5." - Large Catechism

The Order of Meditation and Prayer

Chief Hymn: Evangelical Lutheran Hymnary, 491

Genesis 3:1-24: Attack the Word of God so that Adam turns away from the source of life with God – that was Satan's aim. The result was sin – unbelief that separated us from God – and because of it we die and our relationship with God is destroyed. What Adam failed to be and to do, our Lord Jesus did for us. Our deliverance from Satan is bound up with the Son of God becoming man for us, suffering the death that we deserved by our sin, and faithfully trusting in His Father to the end. Where our father Adam wavered and fell, Jesus remained steadfast and immovable from His faith in the Father.

2 Corinthians 6:1-10: As long as we live, the Lord's call remains constant: "Now is the day of salvation! Come to Me!"

Matthew 4:1-11: "Man does not live by bread alone, but by every Word that proceeds out of the mouth of God." Every step of the way in His time of testing and temptation from the evil one, Jesus quoted Scripture and defended Himself and the honor of His Father with the Word of God. Even when Satan twisted and misused God's Word, Jesus countered by faithfully proclaiming God's Word in reply. As strange as it sounds to our ears, Jesus did not even rely upon Himself; instead, He relied solely upon His Father's good and gracious Word. He was faithful unto death that we might be rescued from every manifestation of unfaithfulness from our sinful nature.
