P: The Holy Gospel according to † St. John, the 15th & 16th chapters:

At that time Jesus said: “If the world hates you, you know that it hated Me before it hated you. If you were of the world, the world would love its own. Yet because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you. Remember the word that I said to you, ‘A servant is not greater than his master.’ If they persecuted Me, they will also persecute you. If they kept My word, they will keep yours also. But all these things they will do to you for My name’s sake, because they do not know Him who sent Me. synagogues; yes, the time is coming that whoever kills you will think that he offers God service. And these things they will do to you because they have not known the Father nor Me. But these things I have told you, that when the time comes, you may remember that I told you of them. And these things I did not say to you at the beginning, because I was with you.”

Life Thoughts in the Church Year/One Year Lectionary – Lutherans For Life

Hymn for the Sunday After Ascension: “Our help is ever, Lord, in Thee, Who madest earth and heaven!” The CHIEF HYMN *If God Had not Been On Our Side* (ELH 396) is Luther's (1483-1546) paraphrase of Psalm 124, written in 1524. The tune is a Lutheran original, by the chief musician of Wittenberg, Johann Walter (1496-1570). Luther knew the Psalms by heart from his time in the monastery. He wrote hymns to confess and teach the faith and spread the newly-rediscovered Gospel. He used the Psalms as the basis and inspiration for some of his hymns. Luther's theological writings also show his familiarity with the Psalms. He envisioned a plan to write a hymn for each of the 150 Psalms and he encouraged others to follow his example. In all, Luther wrote five Psalm hymns:

Psalm 12: “O Lord, Look Down from Heaven, Behold” (ELH 440)

Psalm 14: “Although the Fools Say with Their Mouths”

Psalm 46: “A Mighty Fortress is Our God” (ELH 250/251)

Psalm 124: “If God Had Not Been On Our Side” (ELH 396)

Psalm 130: “Out of the Depths I Cry to Thee” (ELH 452)
